FSA- Foundation Skills Assessment Gr.4/7

This year, the FSAs for Grade 4/7 will be administered between Monday, January 9th and Friday, February 17th. Each of the three assessments has two components – a written component and an online component. A 'walk-through" of the assessment is available on-line at:

http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/assessment/fsa/sample_tests.htm The FSAs have been administered every year since 1999 and they provide a provincial, system-wide measure of achievement for elementary students. These tests provide a snapshot of information that informs parents, teachers and schools in each district across the province how well students are doing in reading, writing and numeracy. The assessments are based on the learning outcomes of the curriculum and the results help educators plan for improving student achievement.





















Safe Arrival

Daily attendance is a proven factor for success in school, however, if *your child is ill or unable to attend school on that day, please call the office by 9:00am.* We also ask that your child arrive at school after 8:25 am unless there is a specific school reason to be here earlier. Our morning supervision begins at 8:25 am and we want to ensure that the students are safe. If your child arrives after 8:40 am, please have them sign in at the office and bring a Welcome slip to the class as we want to make sure that we don't call you unnecessarily and worry you.



BE SUCCESSFUL LEARNERS!

Here are some tips to help your student be a successful learner:

- Make sure that they eat a nutritious breakfast, as the brain needs energy to learn.
- Check & sign their planner. This way you can keep up to date with their homework and studying habits; and it is a great way to keep in contact with the teacher.
- Have them pack their backpacks in the evening.
 This teaches planning, organization, and responsibility.

- Keep a monthly calendar on the fridge onto which due dates for assignments, projects, tests, etc. can be written. This will help them plan and organize studying times around family events.
