## Erase Bullying



### **Absences or Lates**

If your child is absent or late for school, please phone the school as early as possible to notify the office (preferably before 8 AM). The school office does have a 24 hour voice mail and you can leave a message stating your name, your child's name, grade and teacher. This will avoid a phone call from the office to you in the morning, as well as help us to ensure all students are accounted for as quickly as possible. Please ensure your child arrives to school by 8:35 am. Being late to class can impact your child's day as critical information (ie: shape of the day) is covered early on, as are the morning announcements. Being late can also cause distractions for students and staff.

Just a reminder for students and parents to please check the Lost and Found Box for any missing items. It is full and all unclaimed clothing will be removed for donation prior to the end of the month. ### **Grade 6 Immunizations**

Public Health Nurses will be attending the elementary schools within the next 1-3 months to complete the Grade 6 immunization series. The students receiving vaccines already have a signed consent form and received the first doses in the fall. This is a reminder that if parents consented for these vaccines to be done at school, the following boosters will be provided to the students that started the 2 dose series in grade 6:

- Hepatitis B
- Varicella (chickenpox)
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) for girls only

To decrease student anxiety, we do not recommend posting the school-based immunization dates. If parents have any questions about the school immunizations or schedule, please contact the school or Public Health School Team Nurses.
