Closed Campus	Ladysmith Intermediate School is a closed campus. This means that students are not permitted to leave the school grounds during lunch time or recess break. Special circumstances can be arranged by contacting the school principal.		
Lunches & Snacks	We recycle and compost at LIS. This year we will limit the amount of garbage cans in our school. We are striving towards an environmentally friendly school with the goal of no garbage. Pack it in-Pack it out: Please send foods in reusable containers, metal water bottles, cloth lunch bags etc. We also ask students to take home any garbage and snack/lunch wrappers.		
Personal Devices	Our main goal is to help students to use modern technology in a balanced and healthy manner that supports academic and social/emotional development. It is imperative that students be able to focus during the		



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	day on learning activities, as well as in person social interactions with staff and peers. LIS always appreciates your support.			
	 Devices such as phones, tablets, iPads, and Chromebooks may and can be used in classrooms for educational purposes only, with staff permission. Students are not permitted to have devices out or earbuds in at any other time. To minimize disruption to learning, we ask parents to not text or call students on their phones during the day until 2:26 pm. In case of emergency, where students need to be contacted, parents are asked to call the office. If your child needs to call or text you, they should ask the adult supervising to text or make a phone call at office. In keeping with the use of technology for learning, from time-to-time teachers may allow students to use their personal electronic devices for educational purposes in class. Students are responsible to use electronic devices in an ethical manner that is respectful to self, others, and the school community at all times. Please note: Should you choose to allow your child to bring expensive devices to school; it is his/her sole responsibility to ensure the security of devices at all times. Personal devices are not allowed outside, and therefore should be put in lockers or carried in a pocket if traveling between classes. This is to maximize their physical activity and socializing time. Students needing to communicate with family should come to the office to use a school phone. If they must use their cell phone to contact a parent, students must ask a staff member for permission and proceed to the office to limit classroom distraction. Students are not permitted to take photos or videos of other students are not allowed to post pictures of others online. Devices, including Chromebooks, are not to be used for texting, social media, entertainment purposes including gaming.
